GAS SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS

LAKE MURRAY AREA PHASE I

Sealed proposals for the work of improving the municipal gas system of the Clinton Newberry Natural Gas Authority, South Carolina will be received by and through the Office of the Authority at 1643 Springdale Drive, Clinton, South Carolina 29325 until 11:00 o'clock Am local time on May 20, 2010. Immediately after this time, the proposals will be publicly opened and read in the Authority's office.

All work shall be done in accordance with the Plans and Specifications dated April, 2010. The work shall consist of installing approximately 41,100 feet of 8" PE pipe, 4,260 feet of 6" PE pipe, 9,300 feet of 4" PE pipe and 11,100 feet of 2" in and around the existing service area in Newberry County as described in the Contract Documents.

Proposals must be submitted on standard forms provided in the Specification booklet and must be marked "Proposal for Gas System Improvements".

Copies may be obtained at the office of Heath and Associates, Inc., at 108 West Warren Street, P.O. Box 185, Shelby, North Carolina, 28150, upon deposit of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each set, which deposit will be refunded upon return of the Plans and Specifications, and other Contract Documents, in good condition, within thirty (30) days after the bid opening date to each bidder who submits a formal proposal to the Authority. One-half (1/2) the amount of the deposit for all sets of complete documents, including Plans and Specifications, returned in good condition within fifteen (15) days after the opening of bids will be refunded to all prospective bidders who do not submit a formal proposal.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a deposit equal to five (5%) percent of the net price bid; this deposit may consist of cash or a certified check drawn on a bank or trust company authorized to do business in the State of South Carolina or on a bank insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, payable to the Clinton Newberry Natural Gas Authority, South

Carolina, or a five (5%) percent Bid Bond issued by any insurance company authorized to do business in the State of South Carolina, the deposit to be retained in the event of failure of the Successful Bidder to execute the contract within (10) days after the award or to give satisfactory surety as required.

All contractors are hereby notified that they shall properly comply with any South Carolina state laws governing their respective trades.
