US 411 Phase I and II Gas System Relocation

Sealed proposals for the work of improving the gas system of the Jefferson Cocke County Utility District will be received by and through the office of the General Manager at **122 Highway 25E, Newport, Tennessee, 37821, until 2:00 o'clock pm local time on June 25, 2009.** Immediately after this time the proposals will be publicly opened and read at the Utility District's office. Contractor crew should be prepared to start around July 13, 2009.

All work shall be completed in accordance with the Plans and Specifications dated May, 2009. The primary proposal is for work that shall consist of installing 3,290' of 8" STL on Phase I and 1,520' of 6" STL and 444' of 4" PE on Phase II.

Proposals must be submitted on standard forms provided in the Specification booklet and must be marked "Proposal for US 411 Phase I and II Gas System Relocation".

A Bid Package may be obtained from the Engineer, Heath and Associates, Inc. P.O. Box 185, Shelby, North Carolina, 28151, upon deposit of one hundred dollars (\$100.00). Deposit will be refunded upon return of Bid Package in good condition, within 30 days after the bid opening to each bidder who submits a timely formal proposal. One-half (1/2) the deposit amount will be refunded for Bid Packages returned in good condition within 15 days after the bid opening to those who do not submit a formal proposal.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a deposit equal to five (5%) percent of the net price bid. This deposit may consist of cash or a certified check drawn on a bank or trust company authorized to do business in the State of Tennessee or on a bank insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, payable to the Jefferson Cocke County Utility District, Newport, Tennessee or a five (5%) percent Bid Bond issued by any insurance company authorized to do business in the State of Tennessee. The deposit shall be retained if the Successful Bidder fails to execute the contract within ten (10) days

after the award or to give satisfactory surety as required.

All contractors are hereby notified that they shall properly comply with any Tennessee state laws governing their respective trades.
